The agenda was reviewed and March Minutes were approved.

PRINCIPALS REPORT

We currently will have 2 job openings for the 2019-2020 school year. Mrs Graf will be leaving the district and Mrs. Thompson will be retiring. There currently have been 4 inquiries into the open Pre-School position. Interviews will be conducted the week of the April 15. If the best candidate does not have a teaching certificate they may be able to teach under Mrs. Anderson's certificate or we may have to drop the preschool accreditation. We will advertise for an elementary opening as we have a few teachers who would be willing to move to another grade instead of advertising a specific grade.

The fire marshal conducted their inspection recently and we only had 17 minor violations. We just need to make those adjustments and report back to them when they are complete.

Fall Registration will be held August 7 from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. The fall teacher in-service will be held August 8.

Kremer Foundation Scholarship applications are due May 10. There is \$10,000 available for families in K-6 that meet financial need. We need to have 4 kids apply for the scholarships or we lose the whole scholarship.

Kids Heart Challenge was completed and considered a success.
